Visual Electrical Safety Checks You Can Do

- Check for signs of damage or scorching on sockets and switches.
- Test your RCDs using the "Test" button should trip instantly.
- Look at your consumer unit (fuse board). Does it have modern RCD/MCB protection?
- Check for DIY wiring or exposed cables.
- Inspect outdoor sockets or lighting for weatherproofing and wear.
- Ensure any emergency lighting (if present) functions correctly.

These checks don't replace a formal EICR, but they can highlight obvious risks before problems arise.

When to Book a Professional EICR

Common	signs	that '	vou	need	an	EICR:

- Lights flickering or dimming
- Fuse board is outdated or lacks RCDs
- Circuits frequently trip
- Electrical installation is over 10 years old
- You're buying or renting a property

An EICR will:

- Identify faults, wear, or deterioration
- Provide a coded report for legal/insurance compliance
- Recommend remedial works (if needed)
